Proposals to Conduct Hydraulic/Drainage Study on Drainage Ditches:

THAT a decision on Clifton Associates & Catterall & Wright Consulting Engineers proposals to conduct a hydraulic/drainage study on the drainage ditches in Town be tabled until after the 2019/2020 Provincial Budget due to the amount of snow pack on the ground making nearly impossible to complete an accurate hydraulic/drainage study until after the snow pack melts and to ensure the funding for Water Security Agency's Flood Damage Reduction program remains in place for 2019/20.
